

Delhi Assembly's main hall sanitised after 2 MLAs test COVID-19 positive

New Delhi

Delhi Assembly's main hall has been thoroughly sanitised and those who came in contact with the two COVID-19 positive legislators have been asked to take preventive measures, officials said on Tuesday.

Two AAP MLAs, who tested negative for COVID-19 when they underwent the mandatory rapid antigen test on Monday ahead of the one-day session, attended the proceedings but later left the House after reports of their previous RT-PCR test came positive in the evening, they said.

"The Assembly hall has been sanitised thoroughly. All the members and officers who came into contact with MLAs Vishesh Ravi and Parmila Tokas have been advised to take adequate precautionary measures," a senior official of the Delhi Assembly secretariat said.

Besides Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and his cabinet colleagues, the session was also attended by ruling AAP and opposition BJP MLAs.

On a lighter note, Ravi, who is AAP MLA from Karol Bagh constituency and had tested positive for the virus previously, said coronavirus seems to be in no mood to leave him alone.



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"Perhaps Corona is in no mood to stop following me. I had undergone RT-PCR test at the Assembly before the session on September 11 and it came positive on September 14. People say its re-infection. Feel fine and so far there are no such symptoms. Have quarantined myself at home," Ravi tweeted in Hindi.

Earlier in May, Ravi and his brother had tested COVID-19 positive.

It was mandatory for all legislators to undergo COVID-19 test in order to attend the House proceedings on Monday.

A total of 180 people underwent COVID-19 test at the coronavirus testing facility set up in the assembly premises on Monday. Nine people including an AAP MLA and staff members were found positive, following which the legislator did not attend the pro-

ceedings.

However, the rapid antigen test report of Ravi and Tokas came negative and they attended the proceedings of the House for some time. When their RT-PCR test report came positive in the evening, they left the House.

Before this, 94 individuals, including 29 MLAs underwent RT-PCR test on Friday and no one was found positive for coron-

avirus, officials said.

Various safety measures were put in place for the one-day session, including setting up of a coronavirus testing facility at the assembly for the staff and legislators before the session, and altered seating arrangements to maintain social distancing norm.

-Delhi records 4,263 fresh COVID-19 cases, taking tally to over 2.25 lakh; over 62K tests conducted-

The national capital recorded 4,263 fresh COVID-19 cases on Tuesday, taking tally to over 2.25 lakh, with authorities conducting more than 62,000 coronavirus tests.

Thirty-six more fatalities have been recorded, taking the death toll to 4,806, according to the latest bulletin issued by the Delhi health department.

The active cases tally on Tuesday rose to 29,787 from 28,641 the previous day.

Over 62,000 COVID-19 tests were conducted in the national capital on Monday, authorities said.

The death toll from COVID-19 in Delhi stood at 4,770 on Monday.

The bulletin on Tuesday said the death toll from coronavirus infection has risen to 4,806 and the total number of cases has climbed to 2,25,796.

East Delhi Mayor writes to CM, seeks release of 'due' fund of Rs 1100 crore

The Mayor of East Delhi, Nirmal Jain, wrote a letter to the Chief Minister of Delhi on Tuesday demanding release of the outstanding amount of Rs 1100 crore (two instalments of current financial year) to the East Delhi Municipal Corporation (EDMC).

This aforesaid amount has been demanded to release as per the recommendations of the 5th Finance Commission. Jain said that the Delhi government should rise above political malice and provide the outstanding dues to the



EDMC at the earliest.

The Mayor said that the EDMC is going through a severe financial crisis. In such a situation, it is facing difficulties in providing uninterrupted civil services. Apart from this, the salary of other employees, except sanitation workers, is also pending for three months.

He further said that the EDMC was not given any money under 'Basic Tax Assignment' while other corporations of Delhi were given instalments under it. The workload of EDMC has increased due to Covid-19 epidemic. The employees of the corporation are working vigorously for the prevention of Covid-19 virus day and night.

The Mayor has requested the Delhi government to provide the prescribed amount of 'Basic Tax Assignment' to the EDMC at the earliest and there should be no discrimination against the EDMC in the budget allocation.

Northern Railway GM holds performance review meeting

General Manager Northern & North Central Railways Rajiv Chaudhry held a performance review meeting with the officials concerned of the Northern Railway through video conferencing.

Deliberations were held to keep focus on safety, enhancement of speed, business development units, freight loading over the zone and training and refresher course for staff.

Safety is the prime focus of the railways. The general manager reviewed the

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work done in improving the maintenance standards of tracks, welds and removal of scrap lying near the rail lines.

He advised the divisions on conducting drives to enhance safety and emphasized on focusing on electrical safety on tracks, trains and premises. Enhancing speed of trains is a priority over the zone. Works should be expedited as to complete the proj-

ects on time. Reviewing the status of monsoon preparedness, the general manager took stock of the tree cutting activity and removal of vegetation alongside the tracks.

DMRC 'develops' indigenous signalling technology

The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) claims to have developed indigenous signalling technology under 'Make in India' initiative.

The DMRC took a major step on "Engineers Day" Tuesday towards the development of an indigenously built CBTC (Communication Based Train Control) based signalling technology for metro railway with the launch of the i-ATS, which is an important sub system of the signalling system.

This prototype system as well as a state of the art laboratory for further developing other sub-systems of indigenous CBTC technology was inaugurated at Shastri Park by Durga Shanker Mishra, secretary, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, in the presence of DMRC's Managing Director, Dr. Mangu Singh, Shikha Gupta, Director, BEL and other senior officials from DMRC and BEL.

Speaking on the occasion, Mishra said, "It is a really proud occasion to start something like this which is going to add to our strength on the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative. The way we have promoted indigenization in the development of metros in the country, I am fully confident that this Indian system will also be sold outside and we will be the leaders in this area as well."

Singh termed this

achievement as a major step forward towards the development of indigenous technologies required for the operation of metro rail systems. "This is a very important step towards the development of an indigenous CBTC system. I am sure that we will be able to work together and scale newer heights to completely indigenise Metro railway construction as well as operations."

The ATS (Automatic Train Supervision) is a computer based system, which manages train operations. This system is indispensable for high density operations such as the metro, where services are scheduled every few minutes. i-ATS is the indigenously developed technology, which will significantly reduce the dependence of Indian Metros on foreign vendors dealing with such technologies.

Technology systems such as the CBTC are primarily controlled by the European countries and Japan. As part of the 'Make in India' initiative of the Government of India, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) had decided to indigenize the CBTC technology.

Along with DMRC, Niti Aayog, MoHUA, Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) and CDAC are part of this development. DMRC has been nominated to lead this important 'Make in India' initiative.

DCPCR set up helpline to ensure children under 6 yrs get proper nutrition, immunisation

The Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR) set up its Health & Nutrition Helpline, 'Sehat evam Poshan Saathi' here on Tuesday.

According to DCPCR, the initiative is aimed to ensure that all children under six years of age are provided with nutritional supplements and regular immunisation doses and, all pregnant and lactating mothers receive maternity benefits of Rs. 5000 under PMMVY scheme, adequate nutrition and care under Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS) and Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PM-MVY).

The Helpline was launched by Delhi Women & Child Development Minister Rajendra Pal Gautam at Delhi Secretariat.

Launching the helpline, the WCD minister said, "There are many schemes being run by the government for pregnant women and for welfare of children from 0-6 years, but the major problem arises when these schemes are not able to reach beneficiaries in time. If we can overcome these barriers, many women and children can be saved from severe health issues. He committed to reduce malnutrition and stunting by half by 2022."

Anurag Kundu, Chairperson, DCPCR narrated his



own anganwadi experiences, and drew from his early childhood how transformational anganwadis can be. He lamented that much of the ills that we witness in the school system i.e. low learning outcomes, drop-out, and poor cognitive performance is rooted in brain development in early years which is contingent on nourishment and happy experiences. He explained, "The Helpline works in a way that the caller will give a missed call on 011-41193903 and counselors will get back to them to verify details of caller and address, followed by resolution of their grievances."

The Helpline Number 011-41193903 shall remain operational 24*7 in collaboration with NGO Indus Action and once a missed call is received on the number, within 1-2 days, the team at

the DCPCR shall connect back and register the grievance, which shall be resolved subsequently.

The Helpline is the first-of-its-kind initiative all over India and Delhi is the first state/UT to undertake it. The World Bank, in its report, 'India's Undernourished Children: A Call for Reform and Action', in 2005, highlighted multiple operational challenges, loopholes in proper implementation and weak monitoring & evaluation, resulting in ineffectiveness of ICDS. Similarly, there have been many challenges with PMMVY, leading to inadequate trickling down of benefits to the pregnant & lactating mothers. Thus, this helpline is the need of the hour and aims to bridge the gap between policy intention and policy implementation.

Health and nutrition of children under six and pregnant/lactating mothers is a key priority area of the DCPCR. Last month, the DCPCR constituted Vidhan Sabha Monitoring Committees in all the 70 Legislative Assembly Constituencies of NCT of Delhi, which shall primarily support Anganwadi workers in identifying beneficiaries for ICDS and PMMVY, monitor distribution of ICDS nutrition supplements & immunisation of children besides providing assistance in closing the digital literacy divide to ensure efficient functioning. Moreover, counsellors from Delhi Social Welfare Board will be providing support and capacity-building for the same.

The launch was followed by a panel discussion on 'First 2000 Days of Child's Life'.

N Rly releases booklet on initiatives taken to enhance safety standards during lockdown
