Jaipur: SHO, constable held on graft charge

Jaipur:
The Rajasthan ACB on Thursday arrested an SHO and a constable while taking a bribe of Rs 20,000, an official said.
According to an Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) official, Dausa's Mandawar police station SHO Lal Singh and Constable Bhupendra Singh have been held under the Prevention of Corruption Act.
The SHO had demanded the bribe from a complainant for "settling" a case of loot lodged against him. After verification, a trap was laid and the accused were held taking the bribe amount, the ACB official said.

Northeast rly sets to hold 65th Rail Week Award ceremony

The Northeast railway is going to hold general manager level 65th Rail Week Award distribution ceremony -2020 on February 12, 2021 here at Syed Modi Railway Stadium, .

Rahul to address farmer meetings in Raj

Jaipur:
Congress leader Rahul Gandhi will hold farmers meetings during his two-day visit to Rajasthan from Friday.
Gandhi will address the first meeting at a wholesale market in Hanumangarh's Pilibanga at 11.30 am, followed by the second meeting in Padampur in Sri Ganaganagar at 3 pm.
Next day, he will reach Kishanganr airport and in Ajmer district and visit Tejaji temple in Sursara and hold dialogues with farmers.
Later, he will interact with farmers in Rupanganr and address a farmers rally at Makrana in Nagaur district.

UP registered no fresh fatality in 24 hrs

Lucknow:
The COVID-19 infection tally in Uttar Pradesh crossed the six lakh-mark on Thursday with 179 new cases being reported in a day.
No fresh fatality was registered in the state during the same period.
"In the past 24 hours, 179 fresh cases were reported in the state. The total number of active cases in the state is now 3,320, while 5,89,882 people have been treated and discharged," Additional Chief Secretary, Information, Navneet Sehgal told reporters.
He said that the state's recovery rate has risen to over 98 per cent. Of the total active cases, 170 are in home-isolation, the official added.
The total number of cases in the state now stands at 6,01,898, while the death toll due to the disease is at 8,696.

Assam govt still examining Clause 6 report, says Governor

Guwahati:
Assam Governor Jagdish Mukhi on Thursday said the state is still examining the Centre's report on implementation of Clause 6 of Assam Accord, which had been submitted to it a year ago.
In his address on the inaugural day of the last session of this assembly, Mukhi said the union home ministry had constituted a high-level committee (HLC) headed by Justice Biplab Kumar Sarma for speedy implementation of Clause 6 of Assam Accord.
"The Committee has submitted its report and my government is examining the same from the legal point of view on the suggestions made," he added.
The HLC had submitted the report to Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal on February 25 last year for handing it to Union Home Minister Amit Shah.
In December 2020, state Parliamentary Affairs Minister Chandra Mohan Patowary had told the Assembly that the Assam government was yet to examine the report and was in the process of forming the legal committee,



which was decided upon during a meeting between Shah and Sonowal in September last year.
Alleging that the state government was "sitting idle," the All Assam Students' Union (AASU) and Arunachal Pradesh Advocate General Nilay Dutta, who were part of the committee, had on August 11, 2020 released the confidential report saying that the public has the right to know the contents.
As per Clause 6 of the Assam Accord, constitutional, legislative and administrative safeguards, as may be appropriate shall be provided to protect, preserve and promote the culture, social, linguistic identity and heritage of the Assamese people.
The bone of contention since the signing of the Accord on August 15, 1985 has been the definition of Assamese people. The committee had tried to fix the definition as the tribal, indigenous and all other Indian citizens residing within the territory of Assam as per the first schedule of the Constitution on or before January 1, 1951 along with their descendants.

BJP MLA accuses party MP Virendra Mast's kin of involvement in land grabbing

Ballia:
A BJP MLA here trained his guns on the party's former Kisan Morcha chief and MP Virendra Singh Mast, accusing his family of involvement in land grabbing.
Bairia BJP MLA Surendra Singh presented two farmers--Vijay Bahadur Singh and Ram Babu Yadav--at a press conference here on Wednesday night, alleging that the Mast's family grabbed their land. However, a private secretary of Mast, Aman Singh, said the MLA is levelling baseless allegations and the dispute related to the said land is pending in a court.
Aman Singh said that BJP MP does not give any importance to the allegations of the MLA and the party leadership has itself taken note of his activities.
The farmers presented by the MLA before the media alleged that their land in Shivpur village had been fraud-

ulently transferred in the name of Mast's brother, nephew and son while efforts were made to grab land in Sonbarsa village. "These farmers have spoken about their problem and the MP's family is involved in it," Surendra Singh said.
"It is the intention of our government that if there is any injustice, even at the hands of our own men, it will be opposed and all efforts will be made to ensure justice," the MLA said.
The MLA added if someone dares to do such a thing during the government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, then it is a big thing and should be noted.
Surendra Singh also alleged that illicit liquor trade is going on in the Revati area of the district under the police patronage and he had complained about it to senior police officials but to no avail.

Affidavit on arms licence: Court rejects plea against actor Salman Khan

Jodhpur:
Facing allegations of submission of a false affidavit regarding his arms licence, Salman Khan had a major reprieve on Thursday when a court here rejected the Rajasthan government's plea against the actor and acquitted him of the charge.
District and Sessions Judge Raghvendra Kachhwala pronounced the order, which had been reserved for three after completion of the arguments on February 9. Khan was present in the



court through video conferencing.
The matter is linked to a

case against Khan under the Arms Act, in which the actor had been accused of keeping arms with an expired licence and using these for poaching. Khan's counsel H M Saraswat said, "We are happy that the court rejected the application of the state and absolved Khan of the allegation of false affidavit.
There was not much substance in the matter and the allegation had been made against him just for the purpose of harassment." This is the second time that the ac-

Opposition force Assam Governor to cut short speech

Guwahati:
Assam Governor Jagdish Mukhi on Thursday forced opposition on the opening day of the budget session by moving to the well of the House and displaying placards over various issues.
After reading for just three minutes of his 94-page-speech, Mukhi had to jump to the last paragraph as an unrelenting opposition, comprising Congress and AIUDF, continued to disrupt his address to the house.
The vote on accounts for 2021-22 will be presented in the assembly on Friday.
The assembly session is of three days.
The moment Mukhi started reading about the good-governance of the BJP-led coalition, adopting fair, effective, transparent and accountable policies with zero tolerance towards corruption, the opposition members stood in protest.
The Congress and AIUDF MLAs displayed placards on

various issues and trooped into well of the house.
With the governor continuing with his speech, the MLAs kept shouting slogans to draw Mukhi's attention.
After the governor left the house, Speaker Hitendra Nath Goswami informed that the speech was considered to be read.
Goswami invited all the members of the house to the customary tea party after departure of the governor, but the Congress and the AIUDF boycotted it due to stripping of the position of the Leader of the Opposition from senior Congress MLA Debabrata Saikia.
With the assembly elections approaching, hostility between the rivals is increasing which was seen during the governor's address.
Opposition Congress, AIUDF, CPI, CPI (M), CPI (ML) and Anchalik Gana Morcha have formed a Grand Alliance in Assam to take on ruling BJP in the polls to 126-member assembly expected in March-April this year.

UP attracts investment intents worth Rs 4,500 cr at Aero India Show: Mahana



Lucknow:
Uttar Pradesh Defence Industrial Corridor has attracted fresh investment intents worth Rs 4,500 crore at Aero India show 2021 in Bengaluru, the state's Industrial Development Minister Satish Mahana said on Thursday.
At the recently held Aero India Show, Uttar Pradesh Defence Industrial Corridor fetched 13 fresh investment intents worth Rs 4,500 crore. This included intents for manufacturing of defence ammunition, combustible components and ballistic material, among others, Mahana said.
The minister said the Defence Industrial Corridor has planned over 5,000 hectares of land, of which 3,796 has been identified and a total of 1,369 hectares has been acquired in Jhansi, Chitrakoot and Aligarh.

The defence node land at Aligarh has already been sold out, allotted to companies and along with this we are in the process of acquiring additional land for other interested investors, Mahana said.
The minister stressed that the government has been aggressively pursuing industrial-

isation led development to generate new employment opportunities and uplift the economic condition of its citizens.
Mahana said his department has established an identity of its own during the past 4 years by carrying out reforms to bring transparency in its working.
Referring to the Union Budget, he said that seven mega textile parks are being planned and the state government has pitched in for two such parks in Kanpur and Gorakhpur.
As the Budget is rapidly promoting industrial infrastructure in the form of new electronics and leather parks etc, the state government is also rapidly developing such manufacturing hubs and clusters, he added.
The state government attracted investment intents for Rs 4.28 lakh crore at the UP investor summit held in 2018. As a result of the diligent pursuance of these investment intents, nearly investments worth Rs 2 lakh crore are under active stages of implementation, which has a multiplying effect on employment creation, the minister said.

U'khand CM Rawat okays relocation of over 50 families

Dehradun:
As Uttarakhand grapples with the effects of an avalanche in its Chamoli district, Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat on Thursday gave his nod to relocate over 50 families living in areas extremely vulnerable to natural disasters in four districts of the state.
Rawat cleared the proposal by the Disaster Management Department to relocate and rehabilitate 30 families from Uttarkashi, 13 from Chamoli and four each from Bageshwar and Tehri districts, an official release



here said.
The families belong to Astal village in Uttarkashi, Faldia and Saned in Chamoli, Malladesh in Bageshwar and Bethan in Tehri district, it said. The chief minister also gave his consent to release the funds required for the purpose, it said.

Punjab: Congress holds statewide protest over rise in fuel prices

Chandigarh:
The Punjab Congress on Thursday held statewide protests against the rising prices of fuel and cooking gas.
Carrying placards, the Congress activists staged sit-ins at many places and shouted slogans against the BJP-led Union government.
Leading a protest at Abohar in Fazilka, state Congress chief Sunil Jakhar alleged that every section of the society is "suffering" due to the "wrong" policies of the BJP-led regime.
Jakhar said when the Congress was in power in 2014, the price of crude oil in the international market was USD 104 per barrel and now it is

around USD 60 per barrel but prices of fuel are being hiked.
"As a result, consumers in Punjab alone are facing an additional financial burden of Rs 750 crore every month," he said.
He also criticised the Union petroleum minister for blaming the oil companies for the rising prices.
Jakhar said the Modi government has also increased the price of cooking gas "drastically" while the subsidy on cylinders has been reduced by 90 per cent as compared to what it was in 2014.
Referring to the farmers' agitation, he alleged that the Centre had enacted three "black" laws to encourage "black market



and destroy the agricultural sector".
The farmers from different states have been camping at the Delhi borders for the past two months to get the contentious laws repealed. "But Iron nails have been laid on the roads to prevent 'anndata' from entering Delhi," he stated.
In Phagwara, the ruling

Congress workers staged a sit-in outside the SDM's office from 11 am till 1 pm.
Local Congress leaders flayed the Union government for having "miserably failed" in checking spiraling prices of fuel and cooking gas.
They said the life of the common man has become difficult as these prices have burnt a hole in his pocket.
"Even though prices of crude oil at international level are very low, prices of fuel are going up," they said.
"During the Congress-led government at the Centre, the prices of fuel and cooking gas remained stable and affordable even though the international

price of per barrel crude oil was then high," they claimed.
They also raised the issue of the farmers' protest and demanded the repeal of the legislations.
In Amritsar, Congress activists under the leadership of MLA Raj Kumar Verka organised a protest and raised "anti-BJP" slogans.
Slamming the BJP government for rising fuel prices, Verka said, "This is another step to plunder the economically poor people of the nation." He described rising fuel prices as a "severe setback" to people at the time of economic hardships caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.
