

BJP-JJP panel formed for stronger alliance govt in Haryana

The BJP national president J P Nadra has recommended formation of a coordination committee of ruling BJP-Jannayak Janta Party (JJP) combine for a stronger and smooth coalition government functioning as well as effective implementation of the common minimum programme of the two partners.

Senior party leader and Haryana affairs in-charge Vinod Tawde told newsmen after the two-day visit of Nadra that the said committee is likely to start functioning from October and meet every month for the common minimum programme. It would comprise about six to seven top leaders of the BJP and JJP, he added.

Elaborating upon Nadra's two-day visit to



Haryana, Tawde said that the national president held a series of meetings with the workers, leaders, legislators, MPs and the party's core committee and the ways for a stronger coordination amongst them. Tawde was accompanied by state president O P Dhankar, media chief Sanjay Sharma, state general secretaries Mohan Lal and

Pawan Saini.

On Friday, Nadra had also held several meetings with the party workers and leaders in Ambala and held a workers' rally in Kaithal. Addressing workers, Nadra lashed out at the opposition parties and held that it was the BJP alone which cared for all the strata of the society while most of the opposition parties

promoted only their dynastic politics.

Attacking Congress, he said that it was no longer a national or regional party, but was limited to a brother-sister party. Even senior Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad who quitted it raised questions over its leadership, he held.

Nadra went on to allege that Samajwadi Party (SP),

DMK, Shiv Sena, TMC, RJD, PDP, SAD and others were limited to families. Stating that now the Congress too had become a family party, Nadra held that leaders of several of these parties were on bail and facing corruption charges.

Nadra further alleged that BJP's win in the past polls was a rejection of the vote bank of caste politics being driven by the Congress and other parties. "The Congress had divided people on the basis of caste, religion and region, while the BJP united people," he held.

Aside from chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar, Tawde, home minister Anil Vij, party state chief O P Dhankar, Ambala MP Kattan Lal Kataria, organisational secretary Ravindra Raju, and several other senior leaders attended the said meetings.

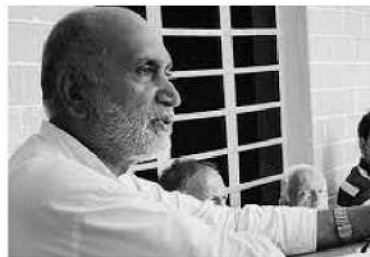
Senior J-K Congress leader Ashok Sharma resigns from party

Congress leader and former legislator from Jammu and Kashmir Ashok Sharma on Saturday wrote to party president Sonia Gandhi and resigned from the organisation.

The national coordinator of the All India Congress Committee's 'Vichar Vibhag' and a member Pradesh Executive Committee, stated that he took the "painful" decision due to the "prevailing situation and unavoidable circumstances". His resignation came close on the heels of an ex-deputy chief minister, eight former ministers, an ex-MP, nine legislators and a large number of Panchayati Raj Institution members, municipal corporators and grassroots workers from across Jammu and Kashmir left the Congress to join the Ghulam Nabi Azad camp.

Azad, 73, ended his five-decade association with the Congress on August 26, terming the party



"comprehensively destroyed". He also lashed out at Rahul Gandhi for "demolishing" the party's entire consultative mechanism.

In his letter, Sharma who had won the assembly elections from Kalakote constituency of Rajouri district in 1996, said, "I loved my party from the core of my heart and fought for building it at the grass-root level for decades together from smaller territorial units to many states of the country." Meanwhile, the Jammu and Kashmir Apni Party-

mu on Saturday expelled a senior leader for "anti-party" activities.

"Farooq Ahmad Khayal, provincial secretary Jammu has failed to fulfil the aspirations of the party despite repeated requests made to him from time to time. On the other hand, he has been found indulging in anti-party activities," provincial president Manjit Singh said.

Expelling Khayal with immediate effect, Singh said the decision was taken in the interest of the party.

AAP govt failed to protect minorities in Punjab: SAD leader Majithia

Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Bikram Singh Majithia on Saturday said the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann-led government has allegedly failed to protect the minorities and maintain peace and law and order in Punjab.

Referring to the incident of vandalism of a church in Tarn Taran district, Majithia said ensuring law and order is the prime responsibility of the government, but it has "continuously failed" on this front.

He said such unfortunate incidents were occurring because the ruling Aam Aadmi Party government was being "remote-controlled from Delhi".

Asserting that the Sikhism always accorded due respect to people of all faiths, Majithia said, "The teachings of Guru Sahibn have always taught us love, respect and tolerance for everyone. It is our duty to keep every minority in Punjab safe and secure. Punjab will never tolerate any harm coming to them." Four masked men had broken into the church in Tarn Taran, vandalised it and fled after setting the pastor's car on fire on Tuesday night.

The SAD leader condemned the "manner" in which the home ministry was being run and said Chief Minister Mann was directly responsible for "this state of affairs".

The former minister stressed that the government needed to get its act together and ensure law and order in the state.

Instead, the Punjab government was concentrating on providing security cover to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, he alleged.

"Kejriwal must be the only person who has Z-plus security cover from both the Centre and the Punjab government," Majithia claimed.

He also alleged a scam in Punjab's excise policy and demanded a probe by the Central Bureau of Investigation and the Enforcement Directorate into it.

Kejriwal, Mann to discuss on how to make India No.1 in Hisar on Sep 7, says AAP

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) will kick-start its "Make India No.1" campaign from Hisar in Haryana on September 7 where Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and his Punjab counterpart Bhagwant Mann will put forth their "point of view" on how to make the country number one in every field, party officials said on Saturday. People from across the state, including youths and students, will participate in the programme, senior AAP leader and former Haryana MP Ashok Tanwar told reporters here.

He said the campaign will be inaugurated by Kejriwal and Mann in Hisar on September 7 and a tricolor yatra will be taken out in Ambapur on September 8.

Both the chief ministers will address a rally in which people from all over the state will participate, Tanwar said.

It has been 75 years since

Senior AAP leader and former Gurugram MLA Umesh Aggarwal said issues like unemployment in Haryana, farmers' debt burden, establishment of industries and how will the state and the country will become number one in the world will be discussed during the programme.

Haryana CM to inaugurate 96 projects & lay foundation stone of 73 projects on Sunday

Haryana Chief Minister, Manohar Lal will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of various state level projects at Dr Mangal Sen Auditorium in Karnal on September 4.

The Chief Minister will inaugurate 96 projects worth Rs 2000 crore and lay the foundation stone of 73 projects through online medium. On this occasion, programmes have been organized in the districts of the state where Deputy Chief Minister, Ministers, MPs and MLAs will also be present.

The Chief Minister will lay the foundation stone of the new Secretariat building to be constructed by the Revenue Department in Charkhi Dadri district and also dedicate projects worth Rs 300 crore to Faridabad district.

Manohar Lal will also inaugurate and lay foundation stones for several development projects in Fatehabad.



Besides this, he will also lay the foundation stone of a 200-bedded civil hospital to be built by the Health Department at a cost of Rs 234 crore in Sector-9, Fatehabad. He will also inaugurate a new bus stand of cost Rs 20 crore, constructed by the Transport Department in Fatehabad. Along with this, the Chief Minister will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of several road projects in Fatehabad.

The Chief Minister will also inaugurate and lay foundation stones of projects of worth Rs 26 crore in Gurugram district. He will lay the foundation stone of four sub-stations costing around Rs 23 crore under Dakshin Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam in Hisar.

Besides this, he will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of several school buildings in Jhajjar. He will also inaugurate the new building and trauma centre of ICU/HDU costing about Rs.3 crore, constructed by the Health Department at Civil Hospital in Bahadurgarh.

Manohar Lal will inaugurate and lay the founda-

tion stone for several projects of the Irrigation Department in Jind. He will also inaugurate Primary Health Centres at Sinsar, Karnagarh, Karsindhu and Ramrai in Jind, constructed at the cost of Rs 115 crore by the Health Department. The Chief Minister will also inaugurate the Administrative Block (SDM Office) at SDO Civil Complex at Safidon, constructed at the cost of Rs. 10 crore by the Revenue Department. The Chief Minister will inaugurate several projects of the Irrigation Department in Kaithal. He will inaugurate the SDO Civil Complex, constructed at the cost of Rs 17 crore by the Revenue Department at Kalayat.

The Chief Minister, Manohar Lal will inaugurate the project of 6 lane / 4 lane Karnal-Meerut road (RD 0 to 2800) up to sugar mill and 4-lane from sugar mill (RD 2800 to 14670) up to Haryana-UP border, constructed at a cost of Rs. 130

crore by PWD Department in Karnal. He will also lay the foundation stone for an indoor sports complex at a cost of Rs 37 crore to be built by Karnal Smart City Limited. The Chief Minister will lay the foundation stone of Phase-2 of the redevelopment of sports facilities at Karnal Stadium by Karnal Smart City Limited.

The Chief Minister will lay the foundation stone and inaugurate projects of worth Rs 23 crore of various departments in Kurukshetra includes the inauguration of the HL Bridge over the Markanda River and the new school building at village Bir Mathana in constituency Ladwa. The Chief Minister will inaugurate the Primary Health Centre at Malra Bass village with residential facility at Mahendragarh, constructed at a cost of about Rs 3 crore by the Health Department. He will also inaugurate Government ITIs at Satnali and Sehlang.

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Dynasty politics by Congress caused great loss to country, says Javadekar

Former Union minister and BJP leader Prakash Javadekar on Saturday targeted the Congress, saying the dynasty politics by it has caused a great loss to the country. In an apparent reference to Congress president Sonia Gandhi and former party chief Rahul Gandhi, he said both mother-son duo has been running the party.

"Have there been elections held," he asked raising a question over the selection of the party president.

"Look at our party, be it PM Modi and other leaders Rajnath Singh, Nitin Gadkari, J P Nadra or Amit



Shah, from where did they come," he asked at a programme here.

"They came from ordinary families with no political background, muscle or money power," he added. Javadekar also hit back at former Rajasthan deputy CM and Congress leader Sachin Pilot, who recently raised a question

of the election of the BJP chief.

The dynasty politics of the Congress has caused a great loss to the country, he said. "This cannot happen anywhere else," he added attacking the Congress, which is set to elect its new president in October this year. Javadekar also claimed that the BJP will win the Rajasthan Assembly elections in 2023 and the general election in 2024.

The former Union minister said there have been no allegations of corruption against any of the central ministers in the past eight years.

"The opposition has not

been able to level corruption charges against any of the central ministers. This is not a general thing," he said crediting PM Narendra Modi with eradicating corruption.

The BJP leader was speaking on the book, 'Modi@20', at the auditorium of a private university here.

Appreciating the works of state BJP president Satish Poonia, Javadekar said, "Poonia has said that he will not wear a 'safa' till the party comes to power in the state. The BJP will form the government in Rajasthan with a strong mandate and I will make him wear the 'safa'."

25 lakh households get zero electricity bills: Punjab Power minister

The AAP government in Punjab has fulfilled its promise of providing 300 units of free electricity per month and as such 25 lakh domestic consumers have received zero bills, state Power Minister Harbhajan Singh said Saturday.

In a statement, he claimed this was the first time a government is fulfilling its election promises in the initial year itself.

Otherwise, previous governments have been fulfilling election promises only in the last year of their tenure, Singh claimed.

The minister said of the total 72 lakh domestic consumers, bills were sent to 42 lakh out of which, 25 lakh have received zero electricity



bills, he stated. The bills are for the July-August bi-monthly billing cycle.

The power minister also

said that due to the two-month billing cycle with the waiver, consumers are getting 600 units of free electricity, which is more than the requirement of every normal household. Before the 2022 Punjab assembly polls, the Aam Aadmi Party had promised 300 units of free electricity per month for each household.

All set for Azad's first public rally in Jammu since leaving Cong

Jammu

Ghulam Nabi Azad, who recently broke his five-decade long association with the Congress, will begin his fresh political journey Sunday from Jammu where he would set up the first unit of his own party.

All preparations have been completed for Azad's first public rally in Jammu, a close aide of the former chief minister said on the eve of the public meeting.

Azad would be accorded a grand reception on his arrival from Delhi Sunday morning, and a procession would accompany him to the venue of the public meeting at the Sainik Colony, former minister G M Saroori said.

Saroori is among over two dozen prominent legislators who resigned from the Congress in support of Azad. The 73-year-old Azad is likely to announce the forma-

tion of his own political party.

Azad, 73, ended his five-decade association with the Congress on August 26, terming the party "comprehensively destroyed". He also lashed out at Rahul Gandhi for "demolishing" the party's entire consultative mechanism.

Since Azad's resignation, a former deputy chief minister, eight former ministers, a former MP, nine leg-

islators besides a large number of Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members, municipal corporators and grassroots workers from across Jammu and Kashmir defected to the Azad camp.

Hoardings and banners welcoming Azad have been put up at the Sattuari Chowk along the Jammu-Airport road and in the route leading to the venue of the public rally, where seating arrangements for over

20,000 people have been made.

"All those who resigned in support of Azad will be present at the public meeting," Saroori, who was busy over the past week in making arrangements for the public meeting, said.

He said over 3,000 supporters of Azad, representing different sections of society, have expressed desire to join hands with him at the public meeting.
