

UP government to start Atal Residential Schools: CM Yogi

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said that with the inspiration of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Uttar Pradesh government has decided to start Atal Residential School.

In the first phase, one school each is being established in 18 mandals of the state. Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay ji said that 'prosperity is not measured by the person sitting at the top of the ladder, but by the happiness of the person standing at the lowest rung.' This school is a humble tribute to the revered Atal ji and a tribute to Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay ji. An innovative initiative to make the dream of Antyodaya come true.

The Chief Minister was expressing his views in the 'Guruvarta Sangam' program of Atal Residential Schools organized at Lok Bhawan here today.

While congratulating all the teachers and newly admitted students on the occasion of 'Guruvarta Sangam', the Chief Minister said that they will follow the National Education Policy.

Will work to advance the foundation of India's education. The physical works of these schools have been completed. Their first session will start soon, which will be formally inaugurated.



Before the inauguration, this program of dialogue has been kept with the team which has to be a part of this innovative program to realize Prime Minister's vision, revered Atal ji's personality and Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay's dream. This dialogue is about what should be the vision of the teachers who will work there.

The Chief Minister said that children of workers registered with Uttar Pradesh Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board will be given admission in these Atal Residential Schools. The Uttar Pradesh government has started the Mukhyamantri Bal Seva Yojana for such children who have lost their parents during the Corona period. Such

children will also be given priority in admission in these schools. In line with Atal ji's spirit that 'A man is neither big nor small, man is just a man', this feeling has also been seen in the admission process of Atal residential schools. Keeping this in view, the Uttar Pradesh government has taken the initiative of Atal Awasiya Vidyalaya.

The Chief Minister said that in the first phase, 18 Atal residential schools are going to be inaugurated in this session. These will be expanded in the next phase. In the remaining 57 districts, one school each is being established by the Basic Education Council.

The Chief Minister said that Atal residential schools

will be run on the pattern of CBSE. There will be all arrangements including lodging and food. The state government and the Uttar Pradesh Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board will take up the responsibility of the entire education from class-06 to 12th. This school is the beginning of building dedicated citizens towards the nation through good values. When the students of this place come out after 06 years, then they can make their identity as self-reliant and capable citizens.

The Chief Minister said that we will have to bring innovation in our work. We have to do such work which can lead us towards self-reliance and prosperity. Na-

tional Education Policy-2020 has added many dimensions in the field of education. Along with education, there should also be skill development and sports activities. We have to create such an environment in the school campus that everyone from teachers to students are seen spontaneously joining the responsibilities of the campus as per the ideal system of Gurukul. This should become the identity of Atal Residential School.

The Chief Minister said that only that society will move towards prosperity, which will be self-reliant and self-reliant. It is your responsibility to maintain the arrangements of the institution to which you are associated. Each school has a large campus of 12 to 15 acres.

On this occasion, Chief Secretary Durga Shankar Mishra, Infrastructure and Industrial Development Commissioner Manoj Kumar Singh, State Consultative Committee Chairman Raghuraj Singh, Principal Secretary Labor and Employment Anil Kumar, Director General Atal Residential School Ms. Nisha Anant, Information Director Shishir and officials of the Labor Department were present. The newly selected principals, teachers and students of Atal Residential Schools were present.

Policy for Hemp cultivation for HP soon: Revenue Minister

The state government will prepare a policy on hemp cultivation for medicinal, industrial, and scientific use thus paving way for utilizing the medicinal properties of cannabis to treat patients, besides raising revenue of the state from the products made of hemp.

This was stated by Revenue and Horticulture

Minister, Jagat Singh Negi while chairing a meeting regarding recommendation on non-narcotic use of cannabis. He said that the policy would be framed keeping in view the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, and Narcotic Drug and Psychotropic Substance Rules, 1989.

The government was committed to curb the menace of drug abuse and

various steps were being taken in this regard. Therefore, the cultivation of cannabis will be limited to only industrial, medicinal and scientific use. The step would further reaffirm the government's commitment to safeguard the interests of the farmers and consumers. He added that various products can be made using cannabis plant thus fetching good amount.

Haryana CM Khattar announces 'car free' Tuesdays in Karnal launches cycle rally

In a bid to check pollution, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar Friday announced that Tuesdays will now be designated as 'car-free' days in Karnal.

As part of this initiative, all government officials will be required to travel by bicycle on Tuesdays.

Khattar, two-time MLA from Karnal, also pledged that if he visits the district on a Tuesday, he will personally lead by example by riding a bicycle.

The chief minister made this announcement while addressing a gathering of youth during the flagging-off ceremony of the 'Drug-free Haryana Cyclothon rally' in Karnal.

Before the rally's commencement, Khattar administered an oath to the young participants, urging them to stay away from the drug menace.

After flagging off the Cyclothon, the chief minister participated in the rally by cycling alongside the youth, motivating them with slogans of 'Bharat Mata Ki Jai' and "Drug-Free Haryana".

"Thousands of youth participated in the cycle rally in Karnal, setting the stage for Haryana to create a world

record in Cyclothon participation with three lakh youth, going to surpass the previous record held by Madhya Pradesh with around 37,000 participants," an official statement issued here said.

Khattar said that this campaign against drug addiction will traverse through various districts of the state, culminating in a grand youth rally in Karnal on the evening of September 25.

The message of the cyclothon rally, conducted under the 'Drug-Free Haryana' campaign, is poised to resonate throughout the country, safeguarding the lives of the young generation, he said.

"To save our youth from drug addiction, the Haryana government, in collaboration with social and religious organizations, is committed to realizing the vision of a drug-free Haryana," he said.

He stressed that the Cyclothon rally serves a dual purpose, promoting not only a drug-free lifestyle but also physical well-being through cycling, which is akin to yoga and enhances physical development.

Scientific Mining is Answer to HP's Disasters, Prosperity

In Himachal Pradesh, the recent havoc wreaked by floods has revealed a remarkable aspect that demands the government's attention. While floods have caused the most damage along riverbanks, a closer look unveils a potential solution – scientific mining.

Many riverside areas that have undergone scientific mining have suffered minimal damage from floods. It can be argued that by studying the state of mining in Himachal Pradesh's rivers, streams, and terrains, the state could safeguard against future disasters.

The devastating impact of floods, especially along the Beas River in Kullu-Manali, highlights the urgency of addressing this issue. The Beas River has drastically altered its course, posing a severe threat to the surrounding areas, mainly due to the significant mineral deposits extracted from its riverbed.

The Forest Conservation Act has acted as a significant barrier to obtaining clearance for mining activities, resulting in the accumulation of millions of cubic meters of minerals along the riverbed, exacerbating the flooding problem. It's essential to reevaluate and potentially



amend such laws to prevent further disasters.

Understanding the natural dynamics of flooding in the region could lay a strong economic foundation for the state if scientific mining practices are implemented promptly. Areas like Hamirpur, where the impact of floods has been relatively low, owe this in part to scientific mining activities that have preserved millions of cubic meters of mineral deposits under the Plahi Khad. Failing to address this now could endanger the newly constructed bridge and the areas surrounding it.

The authorities, in conjunction with the district administration, must take action once approval is granted. Moreover, the ongoing development activities, which are disturbing soil and stone resources on a large scale in the hilly regions,

pose a threat to the state's major dams, including the Pong Dam, Bhakra, Pandoh Dam, and the newly constructed Kol Dam.

These dams are gradually filling with silt and debris from these activities, making it imperative to recognize and mitigate this threat. Continuous scientific mining in the state could not only mitigate the impact of floods but also serve as a robust economic foundation, aligning development needs with environmental sustainability.

According to Mr. Sanjeev Kumar, a State Geologist in Shimla, scientific mining holds the potential to meet both developmental and economic requirements, highlighting that the demand for time-consuming practices is unwarranted when considering the natural direction of mining.
