



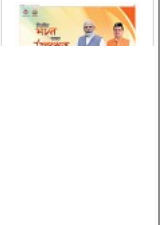

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24x7 assistance and monitoring for flood-affected people: CM Gupta

■ District Magistrates on the ground to lead relief efforts: CM Rekha Gupta

Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Friday stated that her government is actively monitoring the flood situation and providing 24x7 assistance to those affected.



"Relief teams are offering food, water, medical aid, sanitation facilities, and assistance for farmers' cattle. As the water level of the Yamuna River is going down, the people of Delhi are relieved and we are happy," CM Gupta said.

Gupta is overseeing the situation personally while public representatives are engaged with residents in affected areas to help them.

In an online review meeting, Gupta discussed the condition of affected areas and the support being provided. She emphasized that senior officials must keep a close watch on the situation to ensure that sufficient arrangements for food, wa-

ter, medical care, and sanitation are available in relief camps. The government's primary responsibility is to protect the lives and properties of those affected by the floods, and any negligence will not be accepted.

Due to ongoing rainfall and flooding, residents in low-lying areas of the Yamuna had to be evacuated.

Kejriwal slams Delhi govt over poor relief in flood-hit Delhi

Former Delhi Chief Minister and AAP national convenor Arvind Kejriwal on Friday visited the flood-hit Shanti Park area to check the situation. He said people in relief camps were struggling with food shortages, mosquito menace, and lack of drinking water.

"We came to the relief camp to check on the people. They are not getting food on time, there is a mosquito problem but no measures to tackle it, and there is also a shortage of drinking water. We were informed that tents were set up only yesterday," Kejriwal told reporters.

He also said that the situation was a natural disaster but stressed that it was the government's responsibility to ensure proper arrangements. "We urge the government to provide all facilities in the relief camps," he said.

Kejriwal also blamed the poor maintenance, saying drains were not cleaned and debris was blocking, leading to water seeping into many areas.

Appealing to the Centre, he said, "All of North India—Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, and Uttarakhand—is struggling with floods. We urge the central government to provide relief. After the earthquake in Afghanistan, the Centre sent relief material, which was good, but the Centre should also extend help to flood-affected states."

Gautam Buddh Nagar Police tops state in grievance redressal

Gautam Buddh Nagar Police has secured the top position in grievance redressal across Uttar Pradesh, with 27 police stations in the district ranking first in the latest evaluation released by the Chief Minister's Office on Friday. The report, based on complaints handled through the Integrated Grievance Redressal System (IGRS) portal for the month of August, also highlighted the commendable strong performance in contacting applicants and taking feedback.



Police Commissioner Laxmi Singh said the achievement reflects the commitment of the force to resolve citizens' complaints quickly and effectively. She added that when issues are addressed on time and with transparency, public trust in the administration grows. The Police Commissioner also announced that the IGRS team in charge would

be rewarded for its efforts. The commissionerate reviews the grievance redressal process every Friday to ensure efficiency. The IGRS portal, created by the government as an online platform for citizens, aimed at providing quick and accessible solutions to complaints. Officials said Gautam Buddh Nagar's consistent performance in the rankings is a result of systematic monitoring and a citizen-centric approach.

To further strengthen the process, each police station has been directed to designate an officer specifically for grievance redressal. Complaints are to be taken up promptly, with the complainant being called in, heard, and the matter resolved without delay. To encourage the staff, police personnel posted in the IGRS cell have been given cash prizes. Every officer handling complaints at the circles and police stations has also received a reward of one thousand rupees.

All 5 accused apprehended for teenager's killing in Delhi's Rohini over drugs

A minor has been apprehended from Bihar in connection with the murder of the teenager, identified as Kavyan.

The body of the victim was found lying injured on the road driving Sector 7 and 8, Rohini, around 4.30 am on August 25, police said. He was taken to Dr. BSA Hospital, where he died after treatment.

"On the evening night of August 24 and 25, a birthday party was held at a hotel in Rohini, attended by this group and others. Around 2.30 to 4.30 am, Sudhanshu, Prashant and two minors left on Ayush's motorcycle to buy cold drinks and snacks," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Rohini) Rajesh Ranjan said.

Headed to near Sector 7 and 8, Rohini, where they consumed Kavyan and asked him about some prohibited stuff and upon dis-

covered drugs from him, he was arrested for allegedly supplying narcotics to the driver of the Thar that ran over two pedestrians near Gyanesh Murti in Chakraborty near last month, police said on Friday.

The accused, Nubhai (40), was arrested from East of Kailash during a follow-up probe into the August 10 case in which driver Ashish Reddy (60) was caught at the spot, a police officer said.

During forensic checks of the vehicle, investigators recovered suspected narcotics, cash and liquor. The substances found in the SUV included cocaine, LSD, MD, ganja and charas, prompting police to expand the probe beyond rash driving and examine a wider supply chain, he said.

Preliminary investigation revealed Ashish allegedly sourced drugs from Nubhai, who supplied consignments which were then distributed at gatherings and parties.

According to police, the accused driver had rented the Thar to attend a party in Gurgaon and was returning home when the accident took place.

Pilot of private airline held for secretly filming woman in Delhi market

A pilot of a private airline was arrested for allegedly trying to film a woman in a hidden camera in Shanti Bazar in southwest Delhi, police said on Friday.

The woman raised an alarm when she saw the 31-year-old man recording videos of her in the market in Kishangarh village near last month, police said.
