

Haryana CM inaugurates second phase of state-level 'Khel Mahakumbh' in Panchkula

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini Wednesday said that the state government's vision is to make Haryana not only the sports capital of India, but also a global leader in sports, as he inaugurated the second phase of state-level 'Khel Mahakumbh'.

He said that over the past decade, Haryana has developed a comprehensive sports vision aimed at connecting every child with sports, creating playgrounds in every village, and providing opportunities to every youth passionate about sports.

He was addressing the inaugural function of the second phase of the state-level three-day 'Khel Mahakumbh' at the Tau Devi Lal Sports Stadium in Panchkula.

He encouraged the players to compete with a true sporting spirit and give their best performance. Minister of State for Sports Gaurav Gautam was also present at the event.



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Saini said the 'Khel Mahakumbh' is not just a sporting event but a platform that nurtures the dreams of Haryana's youths, reflecting the state's spirit of excellence in sports.

He said that the 'Khel Mahakumbh' was launched in 2017, Haryana's Golden Jubilee year, and since then, five editions have been successfully organised.

In the first phase of this year's event, held from August 2 to 4, a total of 13,410 athletes participated across 26 sports. The second phase, which began in Panchkula on Wednesday, has 9,559 athletes competing, an official statement said.

Saini said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has set the goal of establishing India as a sports superpower by the 2036 Olympic Games and has expressed the desire to host the games in India.

"I am confident that Haryana's athletes will bring glory to the nation by winning the most medals at this time. Preparations for this have already begun. Our dream is that every village in Haryana will produce an athlete who will

make the country proud on the world stage," he said. Saini further highlighted the government's efforts to promote sports talent in the state.

Sports nurseries have been established to nurture athletes from childhood, providing both financial assistance and professional training. Currently, 1,489 sports nurseries are operational, and 37,225 athletes are receiving training in these nurseries, he added.

He added that players aged eight to 14 years enrolled in these nurseries receive a monthly stipend of Rs 1,500, while those aged 15 to 19 years receive Rs 2,000 per month.

On this occasion, the chief minister honoured eight Haryana athletes who won medals at last year's Paris Paralympics with incentives totalling Rs 42 crore.

Haryana athletes excelled in the competition, securing five gold and three silver medals.

Punjab agri minister seeks CCI intervention on cotton MSP

With the cotton crop being sold below the minimum support price (MSP) in the state, Punjab Agriculture Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian on Wednesday sought the intervention of the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) to intervene in the market to ensure farmers get the right price for their crop.

Addressing the media here, Khudian said against the MSP of Rs 7,710 per quintal, farmers are receiving in the range of Rs 5,600-5,800 a quintal in markets.

He pointed out that the area under cotton crop in the state grew 20 per cent this year.

He said farmers brought 1.39 lakh hectares under the cotton crop as against 99,000 hectares last year. The minister said the state government has been making efforts to encourage farmers to diversify from the water-guzzling paddy crop to other crops like cotton, which is arriving in the market, is fetching prices less than the MSP, resulting in the 'loss' of cotton growers.

He said the state government had asked the CCI to enter the cotton market for the crop purchase.

He urged the CCI to intervene in the market so that farmers get the right price for their crop.

Haryana accelerates energy expansion with new Ultra-Supercritical units

Haryana is set to strengthen its energy sector with major infrastructure projects, following a high-level meeting held at Shram Shakti Bhawan, New Delhi, chaired by Union Power Minister Manohar Lal. The meeting brought together senior officers from the Union Ministry of Power and Haryana's Energy Department to discuss strategies for meeting the state's growing electricity demand.

Haryana Energy Minister Anil Vij emphasized the pivotal role of energy in national development, stating, "Energy is the lifeline of any nation, and a robust energy infrastructure is the cornerstone of a self-reliant India." He announced plans for new 800 MW ultra-supercritical thermal units in Panipat and Hissar, which, once operational, are expected to substantially increase the state's power availability.

Highlighting Haryana's significant contribution to the national GDP, Vij stressed the importance of full support from the Government of India to ensure the state's energy infrastructure keeps pace with rising demand. In response, Union Power Minister Manohar Lal assured that all necessary assistance under government policies and schemes would be extended to Haryana.

The discussions focused



on key projects, particularly the Haryana Power Generation Corporation Limited's (HPGCL) plans to establish ultra-supercritical thermal units in Hissar and Panipat. The Union Minister instructed concerned officers to facilitate land linkage and other essential resources to expedite project completion.

Challenges related to limited availability of quality biomass pellets were also reviewed, with instructions to find viable solutions promptly.

Upgrades to the transmission network were also a focal point. Haryana Valdyan Prasan Nigam Limited (HVPNL) proposed replacing existing ACSR conductors with high-capacity HTLS conductors to enhance transmission efficiency and ensure grid reliability. The Union Minister requested a formal PSDP fund proposal for consideration. Progress on the Revamped Distribu-

tion Sector Scheme (RDSS) and expediting contract awards in DHBVNL were evaluated, while UHBVNL sought approval for SCADA and other upgrades in Sonapat and Jhajjar, which were duly noted.

Smart meter deployment was discussed extensively, examining both TOTEX and CAPEX models. The Union Minister encouraged studying the TOTEX model adopted in neighbouring states to ensure timely implementation in Haryana, while both Ministers underscored that consumer data security must remain the highest priority.

Addressing the rising peak electricity demand, Vij requested an increase in Haryana's Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) allocation from 500 MW to 1,200 MW. The Union Minister asked for a detailed proposal outlining installation sites and capacities for consideration.

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Adopt zero-tolerance policy against crime: Punjab CM Mann tells police officers

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday directed commissioners of police (CPs) and senior superintendents of police (SSPs) to adopt a zero-tolerance policy against crime. Chairing a virtual meeting with CPs and SSPs, the CM emphasised that in view of the festive season, it is imperative to ensure comprehensive arrangements for maintaining law and order, public safety, and the smooth conduct of events.

He said that the festive season often sees increased activity by miscreants, potential stampedes due to overcrowding, incidents of theft and snatching, and attempts by anti-social or anti-national elements to exploit the situation. To address these challenges, CM Mann called for proactive and coordinated measures at all levels to ensure



the safety and security of citizens, said an official statement. Expressing concern over recent reports of tension from certain areas, he urged the public to uphold the ethos of communal harmony and brotherhood. The CM also flagged the rising concern over radical and inflammatory content circulating on social media platforms. He said such content, often aimed at provoking communal or political tensions, poses a serious

threat to public order. CM Mann called for robust monitoring of social media at the CP and SSP levels, with all such content to be immediately referred to cybercrime units for strict action against those responsible for posting or sharing material that could disturb peace. He said that, as a border state, Punjab faces persistent threats from forces inimical to its peace, progress, and prosperity, and urged the police to remain vigilant.

Monsoon withdraws from flood-ravaged Punjab neighbouring Haryana

The southwest monsoon on Wednesday withdrew from flood-ravaged Punjab, neighbouring Haryana and Chandigarh, the common capital of both the states, the Met department said here.

Over a week ago, the monsoon had begun retreating from some parts of Punjab and Haryana.

Flood-ravaged Punjab had received 253.7 mm of rain in August, which was not only 74 per cent in excess of normal but also the highest the state witnessed in the past 25 years.

Neighbouring Haryana received 344.5 mm of rain in August against an average of 147.7 mm for the month, marking a 32 per cent increase. Punjab's flood one of its worst flood disasters in decades. The floods, which claimed 57 lives in the state,

were a result of swollen Sutlej, Beas, and Ravi rivers along with seasonal rains caused by heavy rainfall in their catchment areas in Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir.

Haryana also witnessed flooding and water-logging in many parts of the state recently. Crop-over thousands of acres of land got damaged in both the states.

Meanwhile, the maximum temperatures on Wednesday hovered above normal limits at most places in Punjab and Haryana.

Chandigarh recorded a high of 35.3 degrees Celsius, over three inches above normal limits. Karnal in Haryana recorded a high of 34 degrees Celsius, two inches above normal while Hissar and Narnaul also recorded above normal identical maximums of 36.4 degrees Celsius each.
